Tests based on the bioavailability / release of D4 from a representative sample of polymer silicones were performed with the OECD 29 method. It was found that the amount of D4 released from the tested polymers is below the limit of quantification of the method (i.e. 4.4 ppb) and therefore below the NOEC limit of 0.0044 mg / L for fish and 0.0079 mg / L for aquatic invertebrates, values that would lead to classification for chronic aquatic toxicity.
